

#### **Priorities:**



- 2. Promote a healthy and active lifestyle.
- 3. Increase level 1 (extracurricular clubs and intra school competitions) activities and opportunities throughout the school.
- 4. Increase level 2 (inter school competitions) opportunities for all children throughout the school including SEN and G+T.
- 5. To increase the number of children reaching National Curriculum expected levels in swimming.

#### 1. CPD for staff

We are employing an experienced Physical Education teacher to work with staff on a co-coaching basis for one half day a week. This will enable all teaching staff in Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 to improve their expertise and confidence when delivering PE lessons to their classes.

We also have two teaching assistants with PE expertise who work with the teachers in KS1and KS2 to provide high quality PE lessons.

#### 2. Healthy and active lifestyle

A variety of events are being put into place to encourage all children to lead an active and healthy lifestyle. This includes implementing a healthy week in school and bikeability training for year 5.

Two classes per half term access a session on Judo, led by trained leaders in Judo.

A change 4 Life club runs for year 1 and 2 children alongside children in years 4-6 which primarily encourages children to become active and make healthy choices in their lives.

Play leaders from KS2 also take turns to be on the KS1 playground, organising and encourage physical activities during lunch times.
