## **Barriers to learning at our school**

A significant proportion of the children at our school face the following barriers to learning:

- Learning Behaviours – lack of resilience, confidence and endurance
- Low aspirations
- Social and emotional behavioural difficulties

We will ensure that our allocation of Pupil Premium spending addresses these barriers directly to ensure that it represents value for money.

## **Intent for spending of Pupil Premium**

- The Pupil Premium will be used to provide additional educational support to raise achievement and attainment for eligible pupils.
- The Pupil Premium will be used to narrow the achievement gap between eligible pupils and their peers.
- The Pupil Premium will be used to improve the educational experiences of eligible pupils, to have a significant impact on their education and raise aspirations.
- The Pupil Premium will be used to remove barriers to learning for eligible pupils and raise achievement and attainment.
- The Pupil Premium will be used to provide social and emotional support to pupils and ensure the well-being of children in need and often their families.

## **Impact for spending of Pupil Premium**

All intervention work funded through Pupil Premium will be aimed at accelerating the progress and achievement of eligible pupils to ensure they reach and, where possible exceed age related expectations.

## Accountability

The Headteacher and Senior Leadership Team will regularly and rigorously monitor, evaluate and review the strategies we have put into place for Pupil Premium funding. An audit of impact is completed at the end of the academic year and all updates are shared with the Governing Body.

<b>Pastoral/Behaviour Support Worker</b> Worker to support the social and emotional aspects of learning from EYFS to the end of KS2 with PP pupils.	£14,780	Pupils' health and well-being needs are met removing barriers to learning. Families are supported and able to provide a nurturing environment to facilitate learning. Targeted pupils make good progress and reach at least age-related expectations. Improve attendance to improve attainment.
